

Here are some enrichment activities that your child can complete at home to support their learning this coming term. Please help your child complete two or more activities of their choice. Children should bring their projects into school by **Friday 29th March**, though projects are welcome in before then, as and when they are completed.

Reading Expectation

Help support your child's reading by listening to them read for a short while each day. We ask that every child reads five times each week – though, as with many other things, the more frequently they practice, the better they will become. Children are rewarded with the opportunity to read with Diesel the dog, a dip my prize box and a stamp on their reading passport.

Book Week Homework!

We will be celebrating Book Week from **Monday 4th March – Friday 8th March**.

The whole academy have the same homework for this; to design their own piece of bunting for our school library!

Design the bunting to represent your favourite book or author. Be as creative as you like! There will be prizes for the winner in each class! Finished bunting is due back on **Wednesday 6th March**.



Learn through Art

Make a collage of a plant. It could include all its parts, from its roots to its flower. You could use a mix of materials to make your collage. Carefully label the parts of the plant when you have finished.



Learn through research

Using books, the internet, and others people's experience, research a plant of your choice. You could choose a cactus, spider plant, orchid or venus fly trap (or any other if you would prefer!). Write a fact booklet on how to take care of your chosen plant. Include tips on what they need in order to stay healthy and the sorts of places they grow best.




