

Here are some enrichment activities that your child can complete at home to support their learning this coming term. Please help your child complete two or more activities of their choice. Projects should be brought into school by **Friday 17th May**, though projects are welcome in before then, as and when they are completed.

Reading Expectation

Help support your child's reading by listening to them read for a short while each day. We ask that every child reads five times each week – though, as with many other things, the more frequently they practice, the better they will become. Children are rewarded with the opportunity to read with Diesel the dog, a dip our prize box and a stamp on their reading passport.

The further they have travelled on their reading passport, the better their chance of getting to go to Kidzania at the end of the year!



Discover!

Some animals eat plants. Some animals eat other animals. Some animals eat both!



Find out all you can about an animal's food chain. Show what you have learnt, labelling the different foods that are eaten. There are lots of different ways this can be done!



Research!


Go to the library or use the internet to find out about an animal of your choice. Write a fact page about the animal you have chosen. You could include information about its habitat, its diet, as well as what it looks like (2 legs? 4 legs? Fur? Scales?)

You could choose to research a group of animals (eg: nocturnal animals, or reptiles) and write a fact page about the group you have chosen instead.



Visit!

While you are out and about, keep a tally of the animals you have seen. This could be done in a park, by the beach or at a local animal attraction.



Talk about which animals you have seen and which animals you would not expect to see.

Design!



Many animals have adapted so they are suited to where they live. Polar bears have thick fur and lots of fat to keep them warm, for example.

Design a piece of clothing or equipment that could help protect an animal. Label your design and write a description of what you have thought of an how it will help the animal.

Create!

Choose an animal. Find out about where it lives naturally in the wild. What is its habitat like? Does it prefer water or land? Does it prefer grass or trees?



Make a model of your animals habitat (this could be done in a shoe box).

Talk about why your chosen animal lives in this habitat.

Surprise us!

Design your own piece of work about animals to surprise us.
