

Draw a labelled diagram of a flower, showing its reproductive parts.	Write a letter to a pretend problem page about a friendship issue or about puberty, and then write a reply giving advice to help them.	Read another book by Louis Sachar (who wrote 'There's a boy in the girls' bathroom') and write a book review.
Make a time line of your life so far, showing how things have changed for you. It might show things you have learnt to do or things that have happened.	Draw a character from 'There's a boy in the girls' bathroom'. Around the edge write everything you know about that character.	Make a power point or poster about the ways different animals attract a mate (eg peacock showing its feathers)
Measure everyone in your household. Record their heights in a table then use the information to draw a graph. You can include pets if you wish!	Research and build a working model of the digestive system. You will find ideas on the internet!	Research the lifecycle of an animal (insect, mammal or...?) and present it in an interesting way.
Write a diary entry in role as Bradley from 'There's a boy in the girls' bathroom'. Show how he is feeling and what has happened that day.	Use a book or computer to find a picture of a flower and do a carefully observed drawing of it, using pencil, paint or any other medium.	Find a flower on the ground and carefully take it apart to try to find its reproductive parts.
