
## Updates and reminders

## Learning Journey



### English

Linking in with our Stone Age theme this term, the children will read the book, Ug. Later in the term they will read Oliver and the Seawigs. They will read play scripts to find out how they are structured so that they can create their own plays. Finally, as part of a Year 3 theatre experience they will then perform their own play scripts in

front of their peers. Poetry will also form part of the learning this term.

### Maths

In term three we will be continuing some of our learning around multiplication and division. The children will be revising and securing their times table knowledge for the 3,4 and 8 times table along with strategies to solve trickier multiplication and division problems.

The children will then begin to investigate measurement with a focus on money. They will learn about using money and calculating change, alongside solving a variety of problems involving coins and notes.

Towards the end of the term we will begin to learn about statistics and how to display data. The children will run surveys to gather data and then decide how to display their gathered information.

### Ways to help at home

Spellings and home learning will continue to be set termly and will consist of a range of suggested activities that the children need to complete across the term in order to earn points and if they get enough, a certificate.

We can't wait to see the creations for this term's home learning!. Please continue to read at home with your child.

## Learning Journey

Our Learning Journey this term is the Rock and Roll Stone Age. We will be learning about the Stone Age by creating our own Stone Age documentaries and reports. In Science, we will be learning about different types of rocks and minerals, investigating what the words perme-

able and non-permeable mean. The children will also investigate fossils and how they help us learn about the world millions of years ago.

### RE

This term the children will learn about Moses and the Exodus: The story begins with

the **Israelites** in slavery in Egypt. Moses leads them out of Egypt and through the wilderness to Mount Sinai, where Yahweh reveals himself and offers them a Covenant: they are to keep his Torah
