<p>Learning about lighthouses – what is a lighthouse? Can you research lighthouses with your children? Maybe a trip to the library or local museum could help you... Please bring in what you have found out?</p>	<p>At the park can you pretend the climbing frame is a pirate ship – can you climb to the top of the mast? Can you climb up the rigging? Is there anything to balance on to pretend to walk the plank?</p>	<p>What food would you put in the lighthouse keepers lunch box? What is healthy food? What drinks are healthy? Can you draw a picture and write about the lunch and drink you have made for the lighthouse keeper?</p>	<p>Can you make a rainbow fish collage? Share the story of the rainbow fish at the local library or at home – then see if your child can independently make a rainbow fish.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- A range of beautiful shells?</li> <li>- Some dried out seaweed?</li> <li>- Some drift wood?</li> </ul> <p>Take a net and bucket with you and go rock pooling – can you take some photos of what you find?</p>
